Due to the ongoing Covid pandemic, the CLAT Consortium has postponed the Common Law Admission Test -2020 indefinitely. In this regard in order to prevent any academic loss or delay to the LLM batch 2020-21. The University has decided to conduct its own Proctored Online Admission Test.

Components of Admission Test

- Proctored Online MCQ Test – 50 Marks
- Experience and SoP – 20 Marks
- Online Personal Interview – 30 Marks

Important Dates:

- Last Date of submission of application form: 20/08/2020
- Mock/Demo Online Proctored Test: 24/08/2020
- Date of submission of SoP by Email: 26/08/2020 before 23.59 Hours
- Date of Online Proctored Admission Test: 29/08/2020 5:00 PM to 6:00 PM

The dates for online personal interview will be announced to each candidate separately, by email.

Online proctored Admission Test:

The test will include 50 objective-type questions carrying 1 mark each. It shall be of 60 minutes duration.

The paper will be based on the core subjects of the undergraduate integrated LLB or LLB Programme and include Constitutional Law, Jurisprudence, Administrative Law, Law of Contract, Torts, Criminal Law, Public International Law. It will also include questions from research aptitude, teaching aptitude and current affairs.

Devices required for Proctored Online Test:

Computer/Laptop/Tablet or Mobile with video and audio facility with good internet connectivity

All the guidelines relating to the proctored online MCQ test will be provided in the Mock/Demo test dated for 24/08/2020


