







The university has also been at the forefront of organizing impactful conferences, conclaves,

Annual Colloquium IUCN

This marked a historic first for India, as the country hosted the global conference in its 21-year history. Organized in collaboration with esteemed partners, including Gujarat National Law University, the UN Environment Programme, and other leading institutions, the hybrid-mode conference was themed "Ensuring Environmental Sustainability and Climate Justice through Community Action." GMU's contribution to the event underscored its growing stature as a leader in maritime law and environmental governance.

The colloquium began with two pre-events: a teaching and capacity-building workshop hosted at Karnavati University and a research workshop at Gujarat National Law University (GNLU). GMU stood out with its active participation and thought leadership, demonstrating its commitment to advancing environmental law education. The vibrant cultural night following these workshops showcased Gujarat's rich heritage through Garba, adding a memorable local flavor to the global event. Prof. (Dr.) Tanuja Kaushik, Dean Academic affairs delivered a compelling address, emphasizing GMU's unwavering commitment to advancing seafarer welfare through research, collaboration, and actionable solutions. GMU was also represented by Dr. Chandra Kant Upadhyay and Ms. Shalini, whose active participation enriched the discussions and showcased the university's dedication to addressing pressing maritime challenges. 




